Shoreline Community College: A Great Environment for Learning




- Located in Seattle, WA

High School Completion (HSC)


- Receive a high school diploma from Washington state.
- Diploma is recognized by any college or university.
- Begin and complete college-level studies early
- Classes may fulfill 2 requirements at 1 time.

Example:

- English 101 satisfies High School **and** College graduation requirements **at the same time**.
- Same application and process as college students:
 - High school transcript (must be age 16 or older)
 - Financial certification form
 - Application form
 - TOEFL not required

University Transfer

- General Education Requirements (90 credits* at SCC)
 - *Breadth* of Knowledge
- Major requirements (90 credits at university)
 - *Depth* of Knowledge
- Electives
- Earn you bachelor's degree: total number of credits (approx. 180)



*Credits in the quarter system not semesters **Depends on initial English and math placement


